ACADEMIC MEDICINE

Incorporate academic work into your career with the opportunity for research into illness profiles, lifestyle and other limitations in rural communities



ADULT INTERNAL MEDICINE

Managing patients with acute complex medical and chronic disease problems including multiple morbidities and factors affected by aging



AGED CARE

Management of chronic health concerns combined with the challenges in providing appropriate care for the aged



ANAESTHETICS

Skills, knowledge and capabilities of clinical practice of anaesthesia and providing safe anaesthesia practice and post-anaesthesia care



EMERGENCY MEDICINE

Broad spectrum of patient care ranging from assessment, stabilisation, and ongoing management that may include safe transfer



GENERAL MEDICINE

Clinical practice, knowledge and skills to provide high quality specialist services across a spectrum of health and illness



MENTAL HEALTH

Diagnose mental health problems in specific age groups, including depression, anxiety, adjustment disorders, grief, substance abuse, psychoses and suicide



OBSTETRICS

Clinical experience of care of women and infants including skills in antenatal, postnatal care, labour and gynaecology



PAEDIATRICS

Diagnoses and management of a wide range of paediatric conditions, develop skills to influence community and environmental factors to promote wellness



PALLIATIVE CARE

Improve the quality of life of patients and their families facing the problems associated with life-threatening illness, through prevention and relief of suffering



POPULATION HEALTH

Clinical experience in the prevention of illness, injury and disability, and improve, protect and restore the health of populations and individuals



REMOTE MEDICINE

Skills and knowledge in remote medicine to remote populations including unique medical services like Aboriginal health, public health and emergency



ROYAL FLYING DOCTOR SERVICE

Providing extensive primary health care and 24-hour emergency services to those areas that don't have access to major cities



SURGERY

Clinical skills and knowledge of the surgical process, from the initial evaluation through preparation, procedure and post-operative management

Make your dreams of becoming a rural generalist a reality in a rural region that offers unique opportunities.

About Northern and Eyre Training Network

You can complete your entire training from internship to advanced skills training through the Northern and Eyre Training Network and secure your career as a rural generalist.

The Northern and Eyre Training Network covers both Eyre and Far North (EFN) and Flinders and Upper North (FUN) Local Health Networks, providing a broad range of clinical experiences in both hospital and primary care settings. These LHNs offer the full requirements of both Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP) and Australian College of Rural and Remote Medicine (ACRRM) fellowship pathways including rotations with the Royal Flying Doctors Service (RFDS).

Being a valued member of a small cohort of junior doctors and trainees, you will develop close working relationship with other junior and senior medical colleagues and will benefit from the dedicated medical education team and access the usual learning opportunities including tutorials, simulation sessions, journal club and grand rounds.

AVAILABLE POSITIONS

All roles are full year unless stated and offer generous opportunities to learn a wide range of practical and procedural skills in a rural setting.

Internship

Interns are provided with broad experiences across diverse clinical areas including emergency medicine, general medicine, general surgery,

general practice and the RFDS. You will have opportunities to gain valuable experiences with hands-on procedural skills and challenge yourself as you grow through your intern year.

PGY2+

The PGY2+ training program provides rotations designed for Trainee Medical Officers (TMO) who have just completed their internship with the intent of pursuing a career in rural generalism (RG). You will have access to significant support from the Regional Training Hub based in Whyalla and Adelaide Rural Clinical School (ARCS) Medical Education Unit. Available rotations are adult medicine, anaesthetics, emergency, general practice, inpatients, obstetrics and RFDS.

Advanced Skills Training

The Northern and Eyre Training Network will offer 4 specialised areas of advanced skill training (AST), and include anaesthetics (JCCA), emergency medicine, mental health, obstetrics/gynaecology (DRANZCOG/Adv DRANZCOG).

Anaesthetics (JCCA)

Whyalla

Become part of a collegiate, committed, multi-discipline anaesthetics team consisting of anaesthetists and RG anaesthetists, junior doctors, and experienced and qualified nurses. This role enables the requisite exposure to rural anaesthetics cases to meet ACRRM and FARGP requirements for GP Anaesthetics via the Joint Consultative Committee on Anaesthesia (JCCA). This position is available to post graduate year 3 (PGY3+) and above.

Emergency Medicine

Whyalla

Join a dynamic, collegiate, multi-discipline emergency team with GP specialists, salaried medical officers, rural

generalist trainees and qualified nurse practitioners, registered and enrolled nursing staff. These roles enable the requisite exposure to rural emergency cases to meet the requirements of the ACRRM AST in emergency medicine and FARGP requirements including Diploma of Emergency Medicine. This position is available to Post-graduate Year 3 and above (PGY3+).

Obstetrics and Gynaecology (DRANZCOG)

Port Augusta and Port Lincoln

Train with a collegiate, committed, multi-discipline maternity-care team consisting of GP obstetricians, O&G specialists, and experienced and qualified midwives. This position is suitable for candidates preparing for a career in rural general practice or those preparing to apply for the Royal Australasian and New Zealand College of Obstetrics and Gynaecologists (RANZCOG) integrated training program. Rotations would suit trainees looking to undertake training in basic

DRANZCOG, Advanced DRANZCOG (for candidate already holding a basic DRANZCOG) or trainee with DRANZCOG looking for further supported practice. These rotations are based in either Port Augusta Hospital and Regional Health Service or the Boston Bay Family Health Practice for the full 12 months and is open to post graduate year 3 and above (PGY3+).

Rural Generalist Psychiatry

Whyalla

Join a collegiate, committed, multi-discipline psychiatry team consisting of consultant psychiatrists, and experienced and qualified mental health nurses and allied health staff. This position provides rural generalist trainees with either ACRRM or RACGP advanced skills in psychiatry. The trainee will gain experience in acute adult psychiatry and will assess and manage patients with psychiatric illnesses 18-65 years who present with acute psychiatric problems, including affective disorders, psychotic illnesses, substance related presentations, and

acute crises that can occur in patients with vulnerable personality styles. Patients with chronic illness who suffer from an acute exacerbation, are also commonly seen.

Primary Care

Train in general practice with accredited medical practices where you can gain knowledge, skills and attributes in primary care with a focus on rural and remote context. Participating medical practices are:

- Lincoln Medical Centre, Investigator Clinic and Boston Bay Family Practice – Port Lincoln
- Ceduna Family Medical – Ceduna
- Lower Eyre Family Practice - Cummins

LIFESTYLE

The **Flinders and Upper North Local Health Network (FUNLHN)** covers the area known as Flinders Ranges and Outback. Located about 300kms north of Adelaide, with rugged countryside and rocky gorges, dramatic landscapes and scenic roads, 4WD tracks and walking trails. It can be accessed from Adelaide either by a 3-hour road trip or a short plane flight.

The **Eyre and Far North Local Health Network (EFNLHN)** consists of the Eyre Peninsula and the Far North of South Australia. The Eyre Peninsula is of great natural beauty bounded by the Spencer Gulf, the Great Australian Bight and the Gawler Ranges. The Far North is a large region of South Australia close to the Northern Territory border, including Coober Pedy. You can explore and experience a unique culinary range of food and wine and adventurous lifestyle, pristine waters, rugged coastlines, sandy deserts and stony plains that hold abundant and diverse sea and land wildlife. Spend time immersing yourself in Aboriginal culture, art and story telling. Its all on your doorstep via a 35 minute flight from Adelaide.
