About RACE

The Riverland Academy of Clinical Excellence (RACE) articulates the ambition of the Riverland Mallee Coorong Local Health Network (RMCLHN) to be a centre of excellence in rural health – teaching, research and innovative clinical care. This is RMCLHN's long-term commitment to medical education.

RACE offers a broad range of contemporary training in advanced skills and one-stop-shop for career advancement in general practice and rural generalism. Multi-year contracts are also being offered for those who want a secure single-employer contract for the duration of their training. Flexibility for part-time employment is also available.

Accommodation support is provided in Berri, or you can choose to establish yourself in the town of your choosing, knowing that all clinics and hospitals are within easy reach.

AVAILABLE POSITIONS

Internship

Your intern experience will be based in the Riverland General Hospital in Berri and the surrounding general practices, aged care facilities and hospitals. They will provide you with broad 'cradle to grave' hospital and community experience and ensure you easily cover

the required emergency medicine, general medicine and general surgery requirements for internship. You will even get two emergency medicine rotations and time in general practice!

You will have the opportunity to work with experienced healthcare teams, under personalised supervision of experienced rural clinicians and challenge yourself gaining valuable experience with hands-on procedural skills. Being a member of a smaller cohort of interns, you will have access to significant individual support from the RACE Medical Education Unit and develop close working relationships with your junior and senior medical colleagues. The working culture embraces teamwork and recognises that all team members, including you as an Intern, are highly valued for the skills and knowledge you contribute to patient care.

PGY2+

The PGY2 year is an important year for consolidating competencies and taking time to consider future career options. The RACE training program offers you the opportunity to be part of a dynamic and busy medical teams across Berri, Waikerie, Karoonda, Murray Bridge and Mannum.

The RACE PGY2 training program will provide you with rural emergency medicine, anaesthetics, women's health, paediatrics, general practice and mental health options critical for entrance to Fellowship training. You will work in a network of hospitals, general practices, aboriginal health services, community, mental health and aged care services that provide high quality care close to home for our 70,000 residents.

Advanced Skills Training

RACE offers registrar advanced skills and general practice learning following enrollment in either the Australian College of Rural and Remote Medicine (ACRRM) or the Royal Australian College of General

Practitioners (RACGP). In 2022 there are opportunities to advance your career in adult internal medicine, emergency and obstetrics (DRANZCOG) and in 2023 anaesthetics (JCCA), indigenous health, mental health, surgery and palliative care. Positions are available to postgraduate year 3 and above (PGY3+) applicants and are best undertaken as part of rural generalist training through GPEx with a view to practicing as a GP specialist.

Adult Internal Medicine

Become part of a collegiate, committed, multidisciplinary medical team, consisting of two teams of consultants and junior doctors, as well as Allied Health, and wonderful ward staff. The position involves providing medical inpatient and outpatient services to the General Medical Ward at Riverland General Hospital in Berri and the opportunity to sub-specialise or to combine clinical work with academic research or a non-clinical role.

Emergency Medicine

This role enables the requisite exposure to rural emergency cases to meet the requirements of the ACRRM Advanced Specialised Training in emergency medicine (ACRRM AST EM) and Fellowship of Advanced Rural General Practice (FARGP) requirements including Diploma of Emergency Medicine. You will have the opportunity to manage the full spectrum of physical and behavioural emergencies. Developing your skills in identifying critically ill and injured and the ability to provide safe and effective immediate care.

Obstetrics - DRANZCOG

We invite you to become part of a collegiate, committed, multidisciplinary maternity-care team consisting of GP obstetricians, O&G specialists, and a wonderful group of experienced and qualified midwives. This position offers generous opportunities to learn a wide range of practical and procedural skills and is suitable for candidates preparing for a career in rural generalism or general practice or those preparing to apply for the Royal Australasian and New Zealand College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists (RANZCOG) Integrated Training Program. Preference is given to applicants committed to rural GP obstetrics.

Psychiatry/Mental Health

We invite you to become part of an industrious mental health team with resident psychiatrist complemented by qualified nurse practitioners, registered and enrolled nursing staff and allied health professionals. Located at Riverland General Hospital, Berri inpatient mental health unit trainees will experience general inpatient psychiatry and meet the requirements of ACRRM AST in Mental Health. The successful candidate will participate in The Adelaide Prevocational Psychiatry Program (TAPPPs) via real-time distance technology. This position is best undertaken as part of rural generalist training through GPEx or as an independent pathway with a GP College. TAPPP is accredited for GP trainees as an Advanced or Extended Skills position for a 12 month placement.
