AGED CARE

Skills, knowledge and capabilities of clinical practice of anaesthesia and providing safe anaesthesia practice and post-anaesthesia care.



EMERGENCY MEDICINE

Broad spectrum of patient care ranging from assessment, stabilisation, and ongoing management that may include safe transfer.



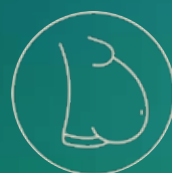
GENERAL MEDICINE

Clinical practice, knowledge and skills to provide high quality specialist services across a spectrum of health and illness.



MENTAL HEALTH

Diagnose mental health problems in specific age groups, including depression, anxiety, adjustment disorders, grief, substance abuse, psychoses and suicide.



OBSTETRICS

Clinical experience of care of women and infants including skills in antenatal, postnatal care, labour and gynaecology.



PAEDIATRICS

Diagnoses and management of a wide range of paediatric conditions, develop skills to influence community and environmental factors to promote wellness.



PALLIATIVE CARE

Improve the quality of life of patients and their families facing the problems associated with life-threatening illness, through prevention and relief of suffering.



POPULATION HEALTH

Clinical experience in the prevention of illness, injury and disability, and improve, protect and restore the health of populations and individuals.



REMOTE MEDICINE

Skills and knowledge in remote medicine to remote populations including unique medical services like Aboriginal health, public health and emergency.



ROYAL FLYING DOCTOR SERVICE

Providing extensive primary health care and 24-hour emergency services to those areas that do not have access to major cities.



SURGERY

Clinical skills and knowledge of the surgical process, from the initial evaluation through preparation, procedure and post-operative management.

Are you passionate about pursuing your vision of a career in rural generalism that includes job security and support? Come and train with nationally and internationally recognised teachers and leaders at the new Riverland Academy of Clinical Excellence (RACE).

About RACE

RACE delivers the ambition of the Riverland Mallee Coorong Local Health Network (RMCLHN) to be a centre of excellence in rural health in teaching, research and innovative clinical care. This is RMCLHN's long-term commitment to medical education and provides access to regular educational opportunities including Grand Rounds with renowned Australian and International guest speakers.

RACE offers a broad range of contemporary training in advanced skills and a one-stop-shop for career advancement in general practice and rural generalism. Five-year contracts are also being offered for those who desire a secure single-employer contract for the duration of their training. Flexibility for part-time employment is also available.

Accommodation support is provided in Berri, or you can choose to establish yourself in the town of your choosing, knowing that all clinics and hospitals are within easy reach.

AVAILABLE POSITIONS

Positions may vary from year to year.

Internship

Your intern experience, based at the Riverland General Hospital (RGH) in Berri and surrounding general practices, aged care facilities and hospitals

meets the National Framework for Prevocational Medical Training for interns. You will be provided with a broad birth to end of life hospital and community experience that covers the required emergency medicine, general medicine and general surgery requirements for internship. You can even pursue two emergency medicine rotations and time in general practice! You will work under the supervision of experienced rural clinicians and with experienced healthcare teams gaining valuable experience with hands-on procedural skills.

Being a member of a smaller cohort of interns, you will have access to significant individual support from the RACE Medical Education Unit and develop close working relationships with both junior and senior medical colleagues. The working culture embraces teamwork and recognises that all team members, including you as an intern, are highly valued for the skills and knowledge you contribute to patient care. RMCLHN is proud to offer you protected education time to enhance your learning. We have a number of visiting specialists attending RGH and can offer further specialist education depending on your area of interest.

PGY2+

The PGY2 year is an important year for consolidating competencies and taking time to consider future career options. The RACE training program offers you the opportunity to be part of dynamic and busy medical teams across Berri, Waikerie, Loxton, Murray Bridge, Renmark, Barmera and Mannum.

The RACE PGY2 training program will provide you with rural emergency medicine, women's health, palliative care, anaesthetics, paediatrics, aged care, internal medicine, general practice and mental health options critical for entrance to Fellowship training. You will work in a network of hospitals, general

practices, Aboriginal health services, community, mental health and aged care services that provide high quality care close to home for our 70,000 residents.

Advanced Skills Training

Become part of collegiate, committed, multidisciplinary medical teams, consisting of consultants and junior doctors, as well as other specialist services, and wonderful ward staff.

RACE offers registrar advanced skills and general practice learning following enrolment in either the Australian College of Rural and Remote Medicine (ACRRM) or the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP). Positions are available to postgraduate year 3 and above (PGY3+) applicants and are best undertaken as part of rural generalist training with a view to practicing as a Rural Generalist (RG) Consultant.

Adult Internal Medicine

Berri

The role involves providing medical inpatient and outpatient services to the General Medical Ward at RGH in Berri and the opportunity to sub-specialise or to combine clinical work with academic research or a non-clinical role.

Emergency Medicine

Berri

These roles enable the requisite exposure to rural emergency cases to meet the requirements of the ACRRM Advanced Specialised Training in

emergency medicine (ACRRM AST EM) and Fellowship of Advanced Rural General Practice (FARGP) requirements including Intermediate Emergency Medicine Training Program.

You will have the opportunity to manage the full spectrum of physical and behavioural emergencies. You will develop your skills in identifying the critically ill and injured and the ability to provide safe and effective immediate care.

Palliative Care

Riverland and Southern Adelaide

This 12 month placement involves providing a broad range of palliative care services in both rural and metropolitan settings, with placements in the Riverland Community Palliative Care Service and Southern Adelaide Palliative Care at Flinders. You will provide palliative care services across community palliative care, hospice and consult liaison services. A robust education program further supports your training to complete your advanced skills training.

Obstetrics

Murray Bridge and Berri

These roles offer generous opportunities to learn a wide range of practical and procedural skills suitable for candidates preparing for a career in rural generalism or general practice. Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Obstetrics and Gynaecology (RANZCOG) Associate Advanced Procedural is available in Murray Bridge

and RANZCOG Associate Procedural and Associate Advanced Procedural is available in Berri. Preference is given to applicants committed to rural GP obstetrics.

Under Development

Advanced Skill Training opportunities to be offered in the future include Anaesthetics, Paediatrics, Surgery and Aboriginal Health.
